**Dead River Hydroelectric Project – Silver Lake & Hoist Developments** <u>Article 402 – Planned Deviation of License Start of Month Target Elevations</u> <u>Article 403 – Planned Deviation of License Minimum Flows</u>

In accordance with Article 402 of the Order Issuing License for the Dead River Hydroelectric Project dated October 4, 2002, and as amended September 1, 2011, Upper Peninsula Power Company (UPPCO) is required to "strive to operate the existing project facilities to achieve the start of month target elevations" and "maintain minimum flows at each of the developments for the protection and enhancement of water quality, recreation, and aquatic resources." Storage basin elevation and releases may also be modified for short periods upon mutual agreement among the licensee, the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE), the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS).

On Monday, March 4, 2024, UPPCO requested to adjust operations at the Silver Lake and Hoist developments allowing for higher start of month headwater elevation targets for the month of April. Comments were received from the agencies and are attached in Appendix A. Approval of the requested planned deviation was received on March 5<sup>th</sup> and we began operating toward the adjusted targets on March 6<sup>th</sup>. Operational data is attached in Appendix B. Total precipitation of 1.75" occurring from March 25<sup>th</sup> to March 27<sup>th</sup> caused Hoist headwater to rise from a stalled 1339.5 NGVD to 1340.68 on April 1<sup>st</sup> ending our planned deviation. Given the continued low precipitation/snowpack agency discussions and approvals had already begun in regard to a second planned deviation for May start of month targets.

On Monday, March 25, 2024, UPPCO made an additional request to adjust operations at the Silver Lake and Hoist development allowing for higher start of month headwater elevation targets for the month of May as well as reduced minimum flows from Silver Lake during the month of April. Comments were received from the agencies and are attached in Appendix C. Approval of the requested planned deviation was received on March 28th and appropriate operational adjustments were made on April 1, 2024.
