Starting with 1355 being the Project Boundary. 1349 reminding us of an event hopefully never repeated. 1346 which is an elevation that most people do not want to see, but can happen. 1343 which is a number that in the spring many / most people could live with. [And then there is 1342](#). And of course the often talked about 1341.

1342 is an elevation that is archived in the DRCI documents, and was actually voted on as a Resolution at the DRCI Annual Meeting of July 8th, 2006. This resolution in our annual meeting process was passed by the shareholders by a more than small margin. Without going into the details, the shareholders approved 1342, and find that elevation acceptable for their recreation needs during the summer.

As we approach the 1342 elevation this summer soon, our Board believes in tastefully pointing out this bit of history. We believe it goes hand in hand with the thought of gracefully and cautiously descending below 1342 to the 1341 target. Driving to 41 at a torrid pace is not what we are asking for based upon the shareholders wishes of 2006.

There are nuances to every inch of the Hoist Storage Basins Shoreline. And we understand that every shareholder has a “sweet spot” for their opinion of the elevation in June, July and August. If Generation, Recreation, and Evaporation all could be kept in balance for those months and 1341 would be the consistent elevation? Most shareholders would be thrilled.

As we have come from most unusual weather events earlier this year, to what seems to be an extended period of calm and more normal rain, are there plans in place to use Silver Lake as a supplemental body of water for the Hoist? Silver Lakes ability to help stabilize the Hoist at 1341 would be great news and a wonderful thought.

Guys, the Board on behalf of the Shareholders appreciates very much the ability to openly communicate with you all. We do realize that potentially

others can and will share their thoughts with you potentially directly. The Board of DRCI attempts to work on behalf of all the shareholders on matters of interest for all 400 families.
